











Primary Project Principles



Welcome

Create a welcoming and inclusive nature center.



Attract

Catch the attention of passersby on MLK Blvd, to draw more visitors to the site.



Protect

Create spaces that compliment the surrounding landscape and minimize disruptions to restored ecosystems.



Perform

Optimize building form for shading, solar gains, daylighting, and energy performance.



Flow

Create a circulation system that intuitively draws visitors downstairs.



Experience

Provide outdoor rooms that merge building and nature.



Observe


Frame views down to Bluff Lake, prioritizing views from the Gateway, Lobby, Conference Room, and Classroom.



Congregate

Create distinct zones for student groups, general visitors, and administrative staff.





GIFT STRUCTURE EXAMPLES



BLNC donors in Colorado can take advantage of the **50% Childcare Tax Credit** of up to \$100,000 per year, in addition to other state and federal charitable contribution credits.

As an example, a three-year pledge of \$10,000 per year would be counted as a \$30,000 gift to Bluff Lake, but could cost the donor only \$3,800 per annum after taxes (33.8% of gift impact)!
